Outstanding Volunteer	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Formally trained for Girl Scout Volunteer position (other than leader) - Performs above the level of expectation. - Benefits the <u>Service Unit</u> - One letter of nomination 	Community Services Director
Super Service Certificate	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Candidate is an individual or organization outside of Girl Scouting - Service performance greatly impacts a troop, group, or Service Unit. 	Community Services Director
Appreciation Pin	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Active, registered adult - Service over and above that expected for position - Service delivered to <u>at least one Service Unit</u> 	Council Recognitions Committee

Honor Pin	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Active, registered adult - Service over & above that expected for position - Service benefiting <u>two or more</u> service units - Contributes to councils goals & objectives - Nomination letter & 3 letters of endorsement giving specific examples of service 	Council Recognitions Committee
Thanks Badge	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Active, registered adult - Service performed is exemplary - Service benefits the <u>entire council</u> or Girl Scout Organization - Nomination letter plus 4 letters of endorsement containing specific information about service 	Council Recognitions Committee
Thanks Badge 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Candidate already has Thanks Badge - Same as Thanks Badge - Plus, Continues to perform the same high level or increased scope of service or used skills to impact <u>entire council</u> in other ways - Nomination letter plus 4 letters of endorsement containing specific information about service 	Council Recognitions Committee
Impact Award	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Candidate is individual or organization outside GS - Service performance is superior beyond expectation - Service impacts <u>several service units</u> or the <u>entire council</u> 	Council Recognitions Committee
Presidents Award	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Candidate is individual or group within the council jurisdiction - Given by president or board of directors for outstanding service during a given year - Letter of recommendation to council president giving specific examples of service & contribution to council goals 	Council Recognitions Committee

President's Service Award	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - All service unit members have taken training for their positions - Retention of 75% of troop group leadership - Attend of designate representative to attend 100% of service meetings during year - Administrative support reflects diversity of service units geographic area - Community contacts maintained - Ongoing contact with troops & individually registered girls - Reports submitted on time 	Council Recognitions Committee

Short-Term	<p style="text-align: center;">Episodic Volunteer</p> <p>This is defined as an adult who gives time to Girl Scouting at the council or national level on a sporadic basis. There will be three types of awards at this level, which may be earned during a specific time period as identified in the volunteer agreement. The agreement may be for a time period of one to three years, with an end-of-assignment review for each completed activity.</p>	
Community Participation “Thank You” Letter	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Has provided a one-time or a one-day service to council or GSUSA 	Community services director
Citizenship in Girl Scouting Certificate	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Has provided a second or third round of service through two or three short-term venues to council or GSUSA - Nomination letter 	Community services director
Social Responsibility in Girl Scouting Volunteer Service Pin Small, Medium, & Large	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Is a currently registered member - Completed Orientation and Training for assignments - Performs fourth round of short-term service <p>Subsequent service pins are sized progressively</p>	Community services director
Progressive	<p style="text-align: center;">Progressive Volunteer</p> <p>This is an adult who is involved in Girl Scouts on a continual basis, rather than on an episodic basis, at the council or national level. Three different awards may be presented at this level. Volunteers may serve in the operational area, which is managed by the CEO/executive director, or in the governance area, which is managed by the president of the board.</p>	
Stage1- The Girl Scout Volunteer Achievement Award The Girl Scout Volunteer Development Pin	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Candidate can hold any volunteer position (governance or operational)- on a continued bases - Is a registered adult volunteer - Has successfully complete all required training - Has completed first year of service - Has committed to returning for another year either in the same capacity or another volunteer position - Nomination letter 	Community services director
Stage 2- The Girl Scout Mentoring Award A Color-coded key	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The operational or policy volunteer has served as a coach and/or mentor for a new volunteer - This has resulted in the mentee committing to year two of service - Nomination letter from protégé, or other volunteer 	Community services director

Stage 3- The Girl Scout Executive Award A Color-coded key	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The policy or operational volunteer has served in a leadership role at the national or council level - The candidate is registered and has completed training for the position - The candidate has provided significant contributions and served in a clearly defined leadership capacity - Nomination letter 	Community services director

Nomination letters should include the following information about the nominee:

- Full name of individual or group. (If nominee is a group, include contact name for correspondence)
- Mailing address, including city state and zip code
- Current home and work phone numbers
- Positions held in Girl Scouts
- Affiliations with other organizations
- Description of outstanding service and its benefit to Girl Scouts

People submitting nomination should provide the following information about themselves:

- Full name
- Mailing address, including city, state, and zip code
- Current home and work phone numbers
- Current position in Girl Scouts
- Date submitted
